• Has Christ been divided into factions? Was I. Paul, crucified for you? Were any of you baptized in the name of Paul? Of course not! I thank God that I did not baptize any of you except Crispus and Gaius, for now no one can say they were baptized in my name. (Oh yes, I also baptized the household of Stephanas, but I don't remember baptizing anyone else.) For Christ didn't send me to baptize, but to preach the Good Newsand not with clever speech, for fear that the cross of Christ would lose its power.

The message of the cross is foolish to those who are headed for destruction! But we who are being saved know it is the very power of God. As the Scriptures say,

"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise and discard the intelligence of the intelligent."

So where does this leave the philosophers, the scholars, and the world's brilliant debaters? God has made the wisdom of this world look foolish. Since God in his wisdom saw to it that the world would never know him through human wisdom, he has used our foolish preaching to save those who believe. It is foolish to the Jews, who ask for signs from heaven. And it is foolish to the Greeks, who seek human wisdom. So when we preach that Christ was crucified, the Jews are offended and the Gentiles say it's all nonsense.

But to those called by God to salvation, both Jews and Gentiles, Christ is the power of God and the wisdom of God. This foolish plan of God is wiser than the wisest of human plans, and God's weakness is stronger than the greatest of human strength.

Remember, dear brothers and sisters, that few of you were wise in the God has united you with Christ Jesus. For our benefit God made him

world's eyes or powerful or wealthy when God called you. Instead, God chose things the world considers foolish in order to shame those who think they are wise. And he chose things that are powerless to shame those who are powerful. God chose things despised by the world, things counted as nothing at all, and used them to bring to nothing what the world considers important. As a result, no one can ever boast in the presence of God. to be wisdom itself. Christ made us right with God; he made us pure and holy, and he freed us from sin. Therefore, as the Scriptures say, "If you want to boast, boast only about the LORD."

When I first came to you, dear brothers and sisters, I didn't use lofty words and impressive wisdom to tell you God's secret plan. For I decided that while I was with you I would forget everything except Jesus Christ, the one who was crucified. I came to you in weakness-timid and trembling. And my message and my preaching were very plain. Rather than

1 CORINTHIANS

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How It Works



Groups consist of 8-12 people from your church community. A Bible reading campaign is also a great opportunity to invite friends, coworkers, or neighbors who wouldn't normally join a Bible study but are open to an eight week commitment to read the Bible in a "book club" model. Just try to keep your group under 12 people— it gets difficult to manage after that.

Meet together once per week, planning to spend 60-90 minutes in discussion. Be sure to honor your group members' time by setting a specific start and end time. When time is up, let people know they are free to leave. Of course, if they want to continue talking then use your judgment to give them options for where to continue the conversation.



Even though you are the "host," the meeting doesn't need to take place at your home. We recommend choosing somewhere that is comfortable, quiet, and free of distractions. Snacks and refreshments are great during or after discussion time. Some groups like to share a meal together before discussion.

Daily Tips

Commit to reading the Bible as you would any other book, from start to finish. At first it may feel strange to read at length without any notes or chapter breaks, but you'll get used to it. While you read, try to resist the urge to look at any notes or commentaries in other Bibles. Simply read the Bible as a story—you can go back and "dig deep" later.

Read the assigned readings each day, which will be around 12 pages. Don't skip any intros or resources from your church; they help set the stage for your reading. Many people say reading and listening to the audio version at the same time is helpful. Try to make your reading a part of your daily schedule.

As you read, think about the topics or questions that you will use to begin your discussion. There may be parts of the reading that stood out to you, or you can find recommended conversation starters on the Quick Start Guide that comes inside the book. Feel free to make notes in the book or in a separate journal.



Meet once a week in groups to talk about what you've read. Treat these gatherings more like a book club than a Bible study. The goal is to have open, honest conversations about your reactions to the week's reading.

Use and prepare to answer the following 4 questions each week. Remember, each of these questions is meant to lead to discussion, not quick responses.

4 conversation starters:

- What stood out to you this week?
- Was there anything confusing or troubling?
- Did anything make you think differently about God?
- How might this change the way we live?

Host Guide

- Encourage your group to stick to the reading schedule. There will inevitably be days when they can't find time to read, but they should try not to fall too far behind. If a group member hasn't finished the reading in time for the group discussion, have them skip ahead to the current week rather than trying to catch up. They can always go back later and read what they missed.
- Incorporate prayer into the experience. Each day before reading, group members should pause and pray, asking the Holy Spirit to open their hearts to receive God's word (we've included a sample prayer at the beginning of each Immerse volume). We also encourage you to open each group discussion with prayer.

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- Have clearly agreed-upon start and finish times and commit to keeping them.
- Sometimes one of your group members will have something specific they want to talk about at the beginning. If so, great. If not, use the discussion questions the GROUP Method to get the conversation started.

Some people may want to search for answers on the internet during the discussion. While this can be helpful on occasion, try to keep it from becoming distracting or disruptive. Encourage group members to stay engaged in the conversation; they can look things up later.

Try to keep the conversation moving. If a question or issue gets to be too difficult, don't get bogged down. Table the topic, contact your pastor for assistance, then come back to it the following




